

A WORD FROM CAROL IN ZAMBIA

My Dear Friends and Family,

I write this evening from a very busy household. Just today, we gained four new children for Kulanga Bana, three of which are little girls. We haven't had little girls for a long time and I look forward to being part of their lives.

I am so grateful I had the opportunity to hire our new house mothers in January. Without them, we could not have taken these precious girls who, along with their brother, are destitute and in need of immediate shelter and care.

School was supposed to open January 8th. However, a terrible cholera epidemic occurred throughout Zambia and schools remained closed until February 12th. It was a very sad time for the country as hundreds of people died.

Because we have been blessed with clean water and a good sewer system, our children were not affected and all is well with us.

Having all the children home all day, each and every day,

presented its challenges, but our teachers and volunteers stepped up and we had classes right at our homes. The kids returned to school with a good head start.

2024 saw six more students off to college or trade school. As of now, 6 of our children are in college and 4 in trade school. I love watching them grow and become wonderful adults that can manage on their own. But also, like every parent, I miss them every day and can't wait for the end of the semester to have them all home again.

We are still busy finishing up the new Redemption House in Chongwe. We're down to buying furniture, light fixtures and paint. We should be finished soon and then it's time to party with a grand opening for all! There are no words to describe how much the children, staff and I (as well as social welfare) appreciate the funds given to build and renovate.

Because of that, we have empty beds for the first time in over 10 years. We are able to take more children off the streets and get as many as possible reunited with their relatives or a permanent place at Kulanga Bana. And that my friends, is what we are all about.

Drought in Zambia

Zambia is once again experiencing a terrible drought. We had rain in December so we planted our maize and it was off to a good start, but the rains ended at the end of the year and haven't returned since.

Two months later, our crop has withered away to nothing but dried grass. The yield is normally what we use to feed our animals and produce mealie meal for the children's nshima. The good news is that we have water and continue to grow the garden vegetables.

It seems we won't be able to rely on the rains anymore and won't plant our crops again until we can purchase some sort of field irrigation system.

Staff Training & Team Building in February

We were blessed with enough resources to hold a four-day staff training for AFCZ personnel at the beginning of February. We hosted it at The New Redemption House classroom.

The Grade 11's went each day to care for the Kulanga Bana children and those remaining at Redemption House cooked, cleaned and served us each day. Both groups did a fabulous job and we were able to relax and focus on learning and improving as employees.

The first day, Carol facilitated discussions and teaching around the topic of child protection. The second day we brought in our counselors from the Abundance of Hope clinic and they taught us about childhood trauma and the effects that has on our children. The third day was all about behavior management and the last day, Francis came in and talked about the personnel and human resource issues. We learned many great things and enjoyed our time together without the children!
